Vocabulary: le pupitre = desk; la gomme = eraser; les ciseaux = scissors; l'ecole = school; le crayon = pencil; le stylo = pen; la regle = ruler; la salle de classe = classroom; le tableau blanc = white board; le livre = book

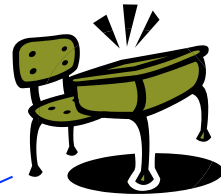
What To Do:

- draw a picture of your 'dream' classroom (Keep it realistic! No McDonalds Drive-thru in the classroom!!)
- the drawing should be titled with La Salle de Classe.
- somewhere on the drawing it should say the name of the school like this: Yarrow Ecole Primaire (Yarrow Elementary School)
- your drawing should include the other 8 of the school items we have learned in French vocabulary
- each item should clearly labeled and underlined. If you run out of room, use a line to show where on your drawing the item is (see below for example)
- a normal classroom has 25 to 30 students, but for this assignment you can draw 10 to 12 desks for students (otherwise it takes too much room)

A project meeting expectations will:

- use all the school item vocabulary words
- have two 'dream' items clearly labeled
- clearly and neatly label all 10 school vocabulary words
- spell words correctly
- show effort into drawing and the layout of your pictures
- have background details are included
- make a good overall impression. Things are spaced out nicely and not 'crammed'
- have objects coloured

A project exceeding expectations will:

- show extra effort into drawing and layout
- have 4 or more 'dream' items clearly labeled
- will create a 'scene' or tell a story rather than just a picture of an empty classroom
- have several background details that make sense
- show extreme care in overall design, colouring and drawing
