Gaming Grant: Every year the PAC applies for this grant. The money goes towards something special for the kids. At this point we are NOT getting the \$5000 as we normally would. *Please find more information on the Gaming Grant posted in Files

Tawney: A new fundraiser we have been looking into are these Safety Reflectors. The samples we have here are similar to what we would get for the school. This we would have as an ongoing fundraiser – always available.

Wholesale they are \$2.78 per clip and can retail for 6.98

PAC would order a bunch and have them always available for purchase

Colleen – money from fundraisers come from the families at the school so can we just make a donation rather than purchase?

Charlotte – unfortunately there is no tax receipt given. Donations need to be \$25 or more and must be deposited by the school. Cheques must be written to the school not PAC. Money also has to be spent by the school not the PAC

Group comment – so many other places/schools/sports teams doing the same fundraisers.

Chair Report:
