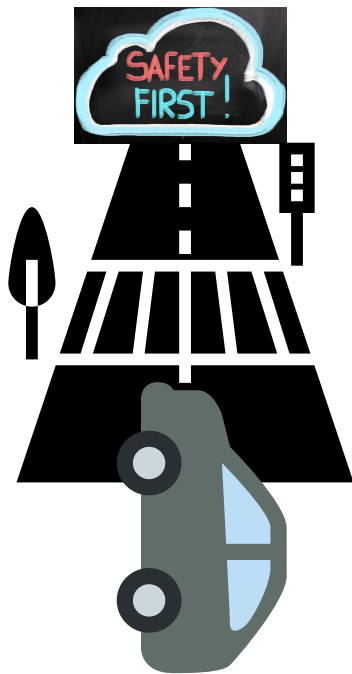

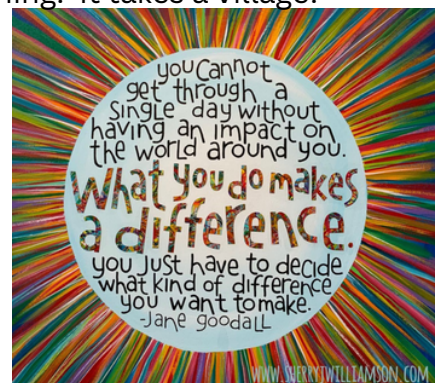

Read a thon/Food Drive

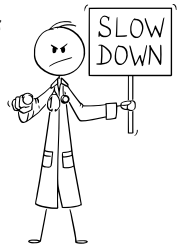

Parking Lot Safety

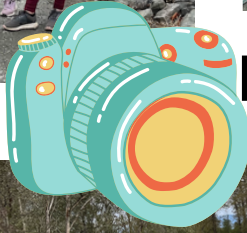
