The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations. We will be discussing that every child matters.

On September 30 we celebrate National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The day honours the children who never returned home and Survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

### Library News

## BOOK CARE

We are back into the swing of things in the library! Students have been excited to come back and check out some books. Please make sure to take care of our books while they are at your home remembering these important rules:

1. Do not eat or drink with your library book

- 2. Do not let your little brother, sister, or pet get a hold of your book
- 3. Keep books clean and dry by putting them in a good spot in your backpack
- 4. Put your book where you will remember it to return each week
- 5. Pay for missing, lost or damaged books so you can keep checking out books

## SUPER READER

We have started up Super Reader again! Students with planners will find the sheets in the first couple pages of the planner. Younger students will be getting their first sheet sent home with them on their library day. You can count back to the first day of school, so if you've been reading since school started, don't forget to count those nights! Make sure to only hand in one sheet at a time on the dates listed on the Super Reader sheets. Make a goal for yourself and see if you can reach it by the end of the year. Our hope is that everyone will be proud of how many nights they read and how much better at reading they got!

## Split Classes Q &

#### Why are there split classes?

Schools organize split grades when the numbers of students need to be balanced out and to provide additional placement opportunities for new students in grades that have unusually large numbers.

#### Are split grades new?

No –They go back to the origins of the one room schoolhouse where all students from grades 1 to 8 were in a single class. There have been years when Yarrow has not had any split grade classes and some years when there have been many. The need for and number of split grade classrooms is solely dependent on enrolment numbers in any given year.

#### How are split classes formed?

Previous classroom teachers help to build new classrooms for the upcoming year. Class composition is very carefully thought out by the school staff. Each and every child is placed with consideration. Likewise, individual needs are also balanced with class dynamics and the needs and compatibility of the group. Some of the other factors taken into consideration are classroom size, work habits, emotional development, exceptional learning needs, social development, etc.

## Is it really possible to teach two different grades?

Just as in the same-grade classes, teachers of split grade classrooms use a wide range of teaching strategies to make sure they cover the curriculum expectations. Students in a split grade follow expectations for their specific grade. Students in a split grade spend time learning as a whole class, in small groups and individually. Sometimes they will be grouped based on specific grade-level task and other times the teacher will group them based on their learning needs.


#### We are here to Help!

Dear Parent/Guardian

Your school bus driver and teaching staff will be conducting school bus emergency evacuation drills in September/October at your school. #### Keep immunizations up to date

You can check the immunization records of your child or the child in your care one of these ways:

- Scanning this QR code
- Going online to <u>HealthGateway.gov.bc.ca</u>
- Using the Health Gateway app

Records for children under 12 years old are on their parent's account. Children 12 years and older need to log in to their own accounts to see their records.

#### How do I get vaccines for the child?

You can make an appointment for immunization at a public health unit. Please call:

- 604-702-4906 if you live in Mission, Abbotsford, Chilliwack, Agassiz, or Hope
- 604-476-7087 if you live in any of the other communities of Fraser Health

If you prefer, you can make an immunization appointment with a doctor, nurse practitioner, or pharmacist. Call ahead and ask if this service is available. All routine vaccines are free in British Columbia.

What if the child had vaccines, but they are not on their immunization record?

If vaccines were given by a family doctor, nurse practitioner, or pharmacist, they might not be on the child's immunization record. If the record is missing vaccines, please do the following:

- 1. Contact the health care provider that gave the immunization and ask for a copy of the immunization record.
- 2. Report these immunizations by either scanning this QR code or by going to FraserHealth.ca/immunizationform
