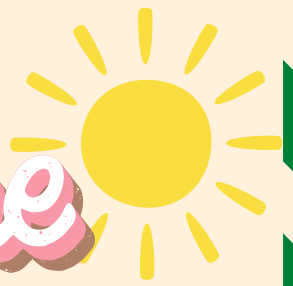

Indigenous Peoples Day at Cultus Lake

On Tuesday June 3, our Yarrow Community School students and staff will gather at Cultus Lake to honour Indigenous Peoples Day—a special opportunity to learn, reflect, and celebrate the rich cultures and contributions of Indigenous peoples.

Students will take part in a variety of learning stations throughout the day, each thoughtfully designed to deepen understanding and awareness through experiential, land-based learning. These experiences reflect our commitment to the First Peoples Principles of Learning, which remind us that learning is:

- Holistic and reflective
- Connected to place, land, and nature
- Rooted in community, culture, and relationships

From traditional games and stories to hands-on art and teachings from Indigenous Knowledge Keepers, students will engage in meaningful activities that foster respect, curiosity, and connection.

We are proud to continue this important journey of learning and reconciliation, and we are grateful for the opportunity to come together on the land, in community, and in the spirit of respect. We want to thank everyone who made this amazing day possible.

School Supplies for Next Year

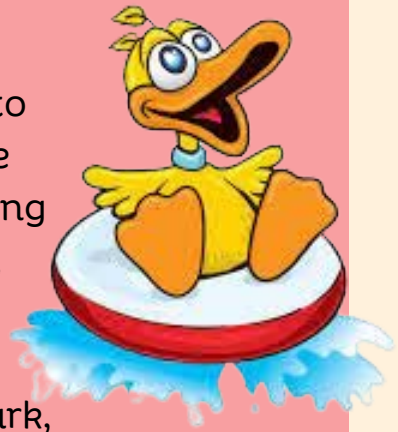
